






Freshwater Wetlands Map






Example: Lewis County

Appeals to Federal Courts

April 2016 – DEC Denies 401 WQ Certification

May 2016 – Constitution Appeals to US Court of Appeals for the Second Circuit

August 2017 – Second Circuit Denies Appeal

September 2017 – Constitution Requests Rehearing from Full Panel

October 2017 – Second Circuit Denies Rehearing Request

January 2018 - Constitution Appeals to US Supreme Court

April 2018 – US Supreme Court Denies Hearing the Case



Appeals to FERC

October 2017 – Constitution Petitions FERC Regarding Waiver of 401 WQ Certification

January 2018 – FERC Denies Petition

February 2018 – Constitution Requests Rehearing

July 2018 – FERC Denies Rehearing



Appeals to Federal Courts – Part 2

September 2018 – Constitution Appeals FERC Denial to the US Court of Appeals for the DC Circuit

February 2019 – FERC requests DC Circuit to remand case back to FERC to review in light of Hoopa Valley Tribe V FERC Case (Decided 1/25/2019)

February 2019 – DC Circuit Remands Case Back to FERC
